




Tanya meets Apsara Author: Rutuja Joshi Illustrator: Mamun Hossain



Meera and Tanya skipped merrily, They pranced in the *udyan*, the park. It was a holiday,you see. No school and no homework! What more could two little girls WISH for?




"Oh, how I wish, I could meet an *Apsara* or a fairy," whispered Meera dreamily.

"Stop being so rude, you little girl. Where are your manners?" She roared.




"Prove it," challenged Tanya. "Prove to me that you really are an *Apsara*! Make MY wish come true!"




And before Tanya could say *Apsara*, she found herself standing near a sparkling blue lake. She was stunned by the twinkling water and the swaying lotuses!

"WH...WHAT, who is that?" she stammered...




"Hey it's me, Biliya! Look down, I am here in the water. It was a catfish! And it was speaking to her. She was astounded.

"Wow, really, are you really talking to me?" She *pinched herself* to make sure that it was not a dream.




"Hello Miss, look, look at us too!" She heard some shrieks. "Down, down here miss. "

"Hey Miss, we are besties, Siya and I! We splash and swim together. We dance and prance together. I am Gia by the way. And we never ever leave each other's side!"




When she heard that, tears filled Tanya's eyes. Suddenly she realized that she was all alone. She wondered where her bestie Meera was. She had left her behind!
